# R01 oPIOIDS: Prescribing Push Reports

- Michigan OPEN – MSQC partnership to provide surgeon feedback regarding opioid prescribing
- Reports display surgeon prescribing, hospital & MSQC aggregate performance and Michigan-OPEN benchmarks
- A select group of surgeons will be invited to an academic detailing session, consisting of expert-guided prescriber education
- Surgeons will be asked to provide feedback on push reports and academic detailing session
- Sites selected to participate have received a request to authorize use of MSQC data for this purpose

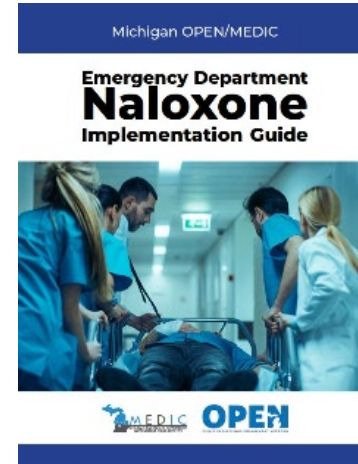

# Michigan Emergency Department Improvement Collaborative (MEDIC)

- Naloxone Rescue Kit Distribution in Emergency Departments
- One year MDHHS pilot grant with new funding through Sept 2022
- Nine EDs initially, will recruit an additional 8-10 sites
- Diverse urban/rural EDs & patient populations
- Physician, nurse and pharmacy champions
- Developed an implementation guide for other interested EDs
- Coordinated 2 buprenorphine waiver trainings for ED providers; 3 more trainings in 2021-2022
