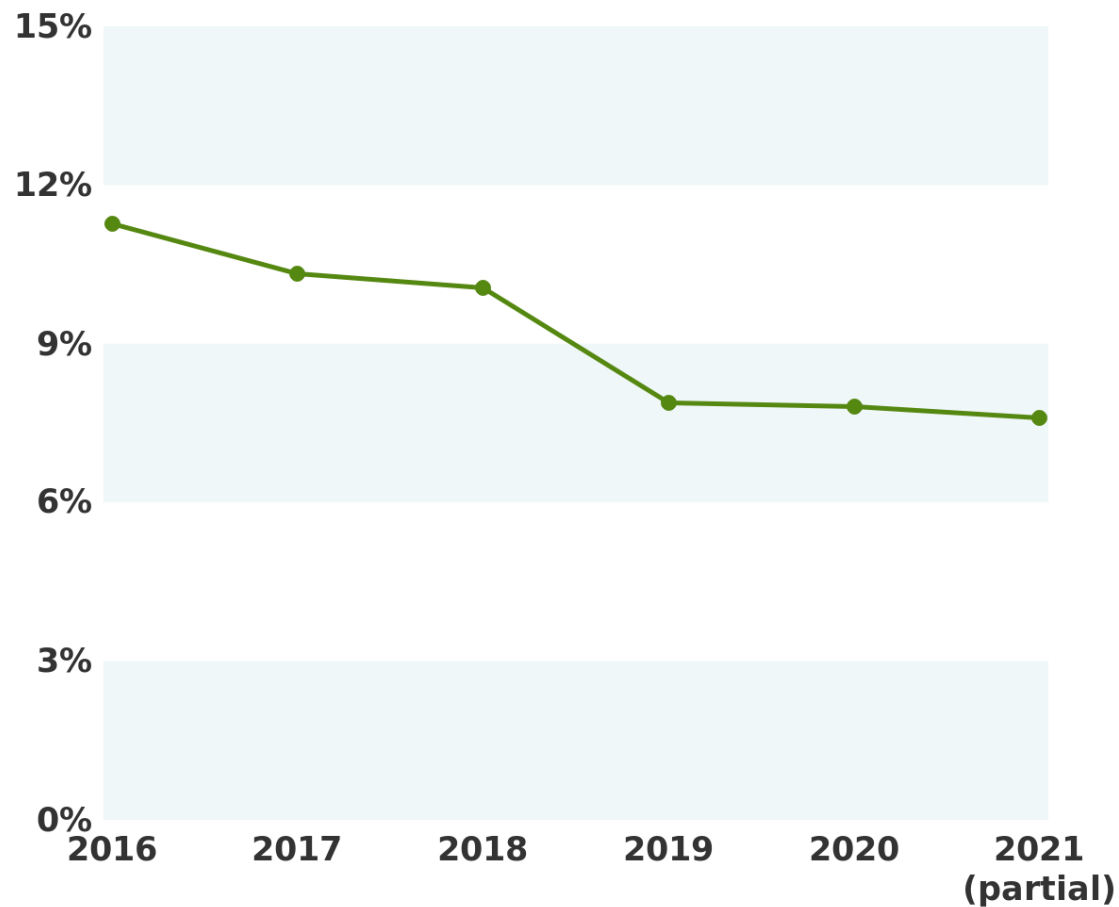

Outcomes Overview - Any Morbidity All



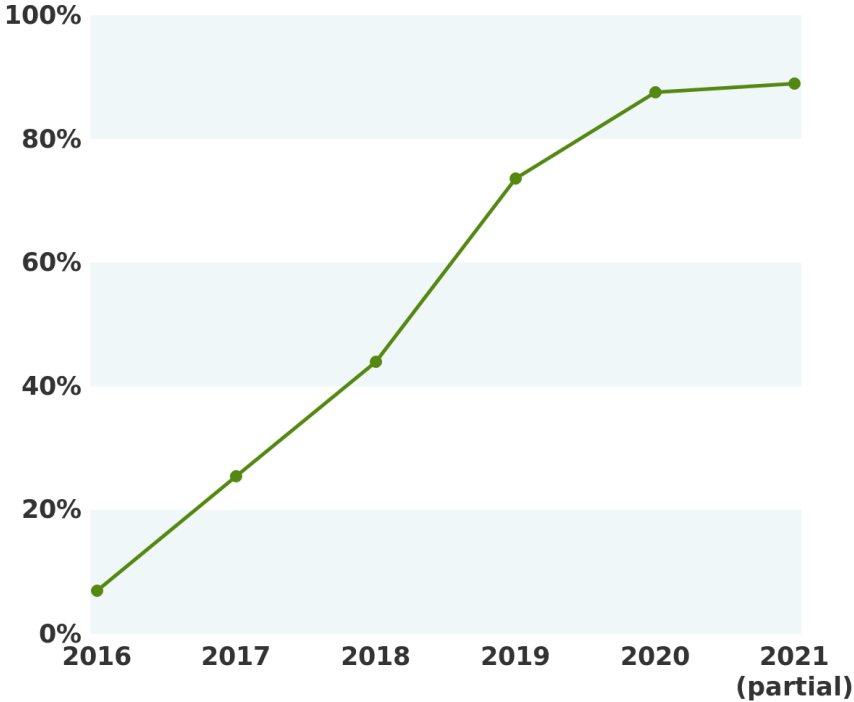

6% by 2025



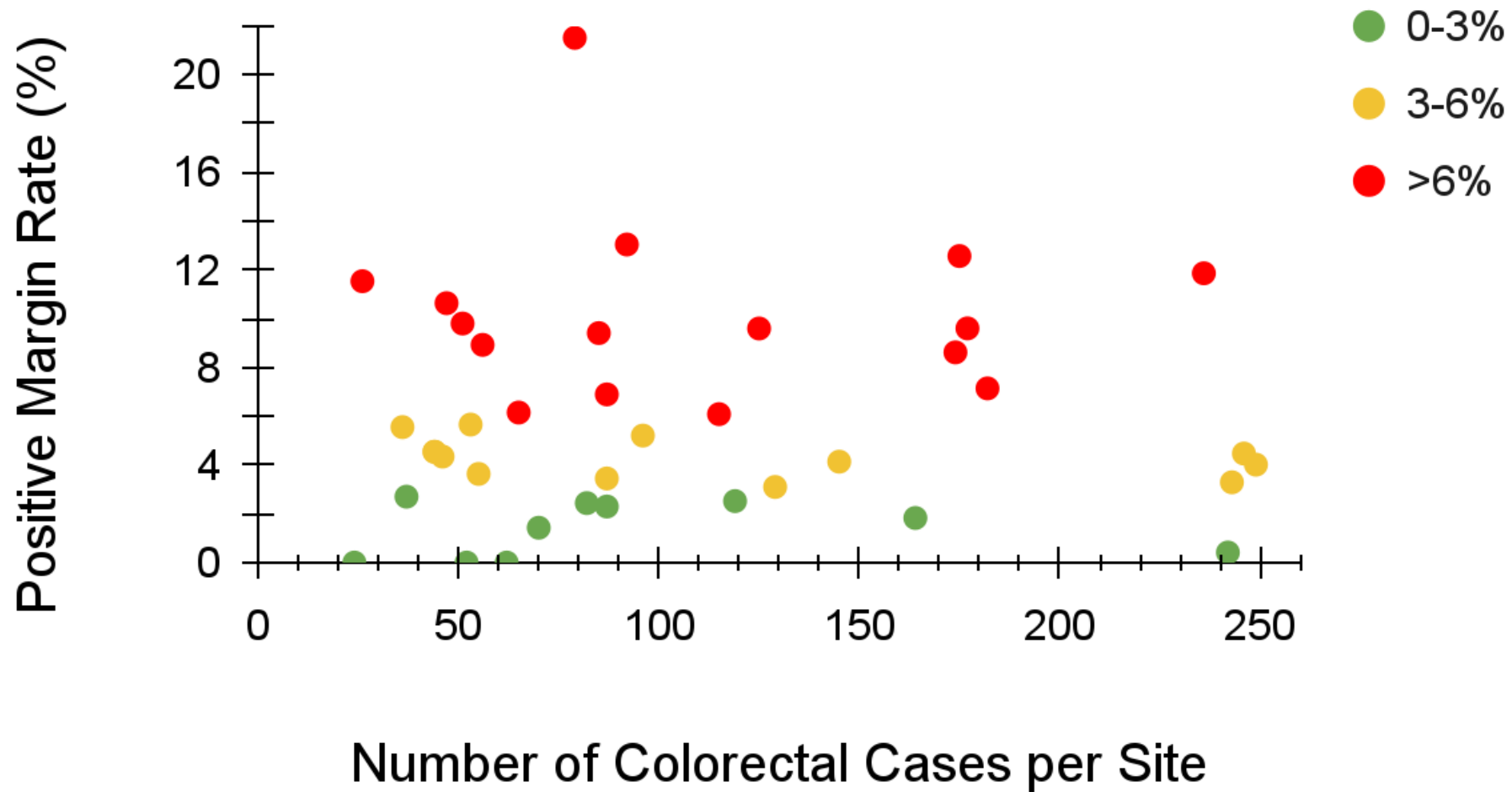
Pathology Factors - Mesorectal Excision Graded

Results from our September poll about future directions and potential initiatives. The topics with the most votes were:

- Surgery in the geriatric population
- Surgery (non-bariatric) in the obese (BMI > 35)
- Prehabilitation/pre-operative optimization
- Surgery in patients with mental illness, especially depression
- Acute Care/Emergency General Surgery

Work is proceeding on:

1. Surgery in the Geriatric Population focused on frailty and delirium – Joint meeting with ASPIRE
2. Surgery in Obese population (BMI >35) - exploring MSQC database
3. Prevention of post-discharge VTE –We have some concerns about the effectiveness of current pdVTE prophylaxis methods.
